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IMS Health & Safety Policy:

H+H UK Limited recognises that its most valuable asset is its employees, and that cooperation on the part of employees is vital for improving health and safety performance. The company shall provide a safe and healthy environment for all employees and contractors working at its sites and so far as is reasonably practicable ensure:

- a safe place of work with safe access and egress
- safe systems of work and safe work equipment
- a suitable and sufficient system of risk assessment

The company is committed to ensuring that the potential for ill-health arising from its activities or premises is minimised so far as is reasonably practicable and to implement appropriate health surveillance to include statutory health surveillance programmes as required under health and safety legislation.

The company is committed to continual improvement of its health and safety performance and operates a management system across its sites that fully conform to the international health and safety standard, BS OHSAS 18001 :2007. This high standard of health and safety is reflected in the design, installation and maintenance of plant, equipment and services, project management and in the care of others who may be affected by acts of the company or its employees.

It is the legal duty of every employee whilst at work to take reasonable care of their health and safety, and of other persons who may be affected by their acts or omissions, and to cooperate, in any way necessary, to enable the company to comply with applicable health and safety legislation. The policy will be fulfilled by compliance with the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, current legislation and Approved Codes of Practice, health and safety management, provision of health and safety advice, health and safety training and consultation.

The policy requires that clearly defined objectives and targets are produced for each of the company's sites and that consultation, monitoring and auditing procedures are in place, and are being used, to ensure business operations meet the required health and safety standards and that continual improvement in performance is achieved.

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The Safety Director has responsibility for implementing the policy, and with the assistance of Departmental Managers, ensuring that it is communicated to all employees and interested parties.
